Session 1 - Health Insurance Exchanges - Dan Schwartzer, State of Wisconsin, Office of the **Commissioner of Insurance**

OCI was created in 1871 to ensure that the insurance industry responsibly and adequately met the insurance needs of Wisconsin citizens. The passage of PPACA changed the insurance landscape in Wisconsin, but OCI's mission remains the same; to be the primary regulator of the insurance industry in Wisconsin. This session will focus on the implementation of the health insurance marketplace in Wisconsin and its impact on consumers, insurers, and providers.

Session 2 - Cracking the Perimeter via Web Application Hacking - Zach Grace, 403 Labs, LLC

Hackers can steal data from an organization with even the most secured network if its web applications are vulnerable. Year after year, industry reports illustrate how vulnerabilities such as SQL injection and cross-site scripting consistently contribute to breaches. Yet, the presence of these vulnerabilities remains widespread. This live demo will show you how these common vulnerabilities allow for authentication to be bypassed, data to be extracted, browsers to be exploited and employees to be phished. The session will also discuss when to consider outsourcing as well as the responsibilities associated with that decision.

Session 3 - 'Lessons Learned' from Co-founding HealthSouth and the Ultimate \$2B Securities Fraud Trial - Aaron Beam

Aaron Beam speaks at university, association and company engagements across the U.S. He, Richard Scrushy (CEO) and two others founded HealthSouth in 1984 and grew the company into a NYSE Fortune 500 company. Mr. Beam departed HealthSouth in 1996 because he and his accounting department were instructed to 'fix the numbers' to meet Wall Street expectations, and he approved it; ultimately costing him his wealth, career and a prison term. Audiences are intrigued by Aaron's first-hand account of the nefarious CEO figure, Richard Scrushy, who built a healthcare juggernaut only to bring it to its knees. The talk follows his book, 'The Wagon To Disaster' to describe a corporate culture that 'worked the system' of stock analysts, auditors and Wall Street investment bankers to perpetuate a \$2B securities fraud. Mr. Beam's discussion includes how to identify 'early on', possible signs of an ethical collapse within key personalities and behaviors to beware of in any company.

Session 4 - The Medicare Cost Report - A Tool for Decision Making and Strategy Development - Kathleen LaBrake and Holly Pokrandt, Wipfli

Strategic decision making may require extensive resources, including time and financial commitment. It can involve mounds of reports, hours and hours of analysis, additional FTEs, or maybe even the expertise of a consultant. We understand that information technology systems provide unlimited information for evaluation, but if you are looking for a quick tool for decision making and

Over the past several years many organizations have adopted some form of public or private cloud computing, whether the IT Departments are aware or not! The initial low cost, speed to market and manageability are very attractive options. Session 11 - ACOs - Within the ACA, Will They Help Providers Help Patients - Jesse Patton, Association Marketing Group, Inc.

Lean principles and methodologies along with their application in the healthcare system will be reviewed. Specific examples illustrating the implementation of Lean tools will be presented.

Session 15 - How Many Denials Walking Do You Have? - Lincoln Fish, Avadyne Health

This session will present best practices for measuring how many denials you have walking. Doing more with fewer resources is the new normal within a hospital's revenue cycle and business office. Finance leaders expectations are that technology is helping employees better manage denials, but that is not always the case. Identifying true denials, tracking follow-up progress and neasuring employee activity vs. results is how the revenue cycle will become an effective source of positive revenue flow for all hospitals from denials management. Take away handouts for use by attendees are part of this exciting presentation. If you want to know whether or not there is a better way to track your denials, then this session is for you!

Servant Leadership: The Only Leadership that Really Lasts - Coach Don Meyer, Northern **State University**

Session Description: Servant leadership is described by Coach Don Meyer as leading by example, inspiring confidence and espect, gaining the trust and attention of others, having the gift of humility, and inspiring others to become servant leaders. In short, a servant leader does not have a reserved parking space. In fact, they set the bar for work ethic and inspire other to reach that bar. Coach Meyer will present from his experience as one of the winningest college basketball coaches in history and use the 5 Cs of servant leadership to inspire us to become better leaders in our organizations.

Bio: Coach Don Meyer is a retired college basketball coach who completed his career in 2010 as head coach of the men's team at Northern State University in South Dakota. At the time of his retirement he was the winningest coach in college basketball history, sitting atop a list that includes other legendary coaches such as Bobby Knight, Dean Smith, and John Wooden. Coach Meyer is currently the 6th winningest coach in college basketball history. Over the course of his career he also coached at Hamline University and Lipscomb University. In his 38 years as a head coach, only one player who completed his eligibility failed to graduate under Coach Meyer's leadership. Coach Meyer is presently in great demand as a motivational speaker and specializes in teaching his philosophy of servant leadership to schools, athletic teams, church groups, and businesses.
